- Grizzly Bear listed in 1975
- Grizzly Bear Recovery Plan developed in 1982
- In 1983 IGBC was created: Purpose, 1). To coordinate Policy,
 Planning Management and Research with the Federal & State
 agencies responsible for Grizzly Bear Recovery & Management, 2.)
 Implement the Grizzly Bear Recovery Plan
- Memorandum of Agreement signed in 1983 by Secretaries of Agriculture and Interior and the Governors of MT, WY, WA, ID.
- The Memorandum of Agreement reflects the need to have top level agency participation on the IGBC.
