

Backcountry and Hunting Related Conflicts

- Increase the availability of food and game carcass storage infrastructure in backcountry campsites
- Develop consistent food storage orders across the ecosystem
- Pilot the guide training video produced by WYOGA and partners this year and work to deploy widely

Front Country and Community Outreach

- Develop specific programs for municipalities and counties. This could include developing partnership funding with NGOs.

Livestock Conflicts and Producer Outreach

- Emphasize prevention vs. reaction. This could include enlisting producers to be messengers and allies.
