Subject: Request for Proposals for IGBC IEO Funding – FY2022 (due 10/29/21)

The Interagency Grizzly Bear Committee (IGBC) mission is to support recovery and delisting, and ongoing conservation of grizzly bear populations and their habitats in areas of the western United States through interagency coordination of policy, planning, management, research and communication.

The IGBC is seeking proposals for grants to partners and agencies to disseminate consistent messages about grizzly bears and to promote effective actions and techniques to increase human safety and decrease the likelihood of bear-human conflicts. The IGBC is anticipating that \$45,000 will be available for grants in FY2022; actual project funding will be contingent on agency funding levels.

To apply, please use the IEO Funding Proposal Form on the IGBC website (<http://igbconline.org/for-educators/information-education-grants>). Please be as specific as possible with a short description of your project and the amount you are requesting using the attached criteria and submittal form. Additional pages may be attached as needed. The project or program proposed must be classified under at least one of the following categories: staffing (e.g. bear rangers), infrastructure (e.g. bear boxes, bear-resistant garbage containers, electric fencing, etc.), or IEO activities (e.g. education materials, bear spray training, bear fairs, etc.). Funds cannot be used for food or catering for an event or project.

Timeline for Proposals and Projects:

- October 1st – Request for Proposals
- October 29th – Proposals due to IEO Ecosystem Chairs
- December (IGBC Winter Meeting) – Funding awards announced
- June 15, 2022 – Interim Progress Reports due to IGBC Executive Coordinator**
- November 1, 2022 – Final Project Reports due to IGBC Executive Coordinator**

**Interim and final reports are required. New projects will not be funded without a final report from the previous year.

There is a two-stage review process:

1. The IEO Subcommittee Chairs and committees will review and prioritize the proposals for their respective ecosystems.
2. After the first tier of review, the IEO Subcommittee Chairs will forward the selected proposals to the IEO Committee Chair for final review by the IGBC IEO Subcommittee.

Criteria for proposals:

- Must be submitted by a qualified non-profit organization, an association, or be a state, federal, or tribal entity focused on grizzly bear conservation.
- Must be consistent with the mission statement of the IGBC and the role and responsibilities of the IEO subcommittee.
- Must be in at least one IGBC ecosystem
- Must be a minimum of \$2,500.

Additional considerations that will strengthen your proposal:

- Proposals that include partners and/or leverage grant dollars with in-kind or matches from partners.
- Proposals that are useable in multiple ecosystems
- Proposals that benefit multiple agencies and organizations.
