Interagency Grizzly Bear Committee Winter Meeting Notes December 12-13, 2017 Holiday Inn Missoula Downtown, Missoula, MT



Welcome & Introductions: - IGBC Chair Jim Unsworth asked for introductions around the table and the room and welcomed Executive Committee members and the pubic to the IGBC winter meeting at the Holiday Inn, Downtown Missoula.

IGBC Advisors Hilary Cooley, Scott Jackson and Frank van Manen, IGBC I&E Chair Gregg Losinski and IGBC Executive Coordinator Ellen Davis were also present.

ACTION ITEMS/DECISIONS

Decision: Martha Williams, Director, MTFWP, was nominated and voted in by unanimous vote as the new IGBC Vice-Chair.

Ed Schiever made a motion to accept the nomination of Martha and Tim Woolley seconded the motion. The executive committee unanimously voted to approve.

Jim Unsworth completed his two-year term as Chair and Matt Hogan moved into the Chair position from Vice-Chair.

Decision: A decision was made to hold our IGBC summer meeting on the west side of the NCDE ecosystem this year. A suggestion was made to see if there were accommodations available in Polson.

Who: Ellen will start working on this to see what lodging facilities are available to accommodate the IGBC summer meeting.

Update: Ellen was able to secure a block of government rate rooms and conference room at the KwaTaqNuk Resort and Casino in Polson, MT. The summer meeting dates are June 19-21. Ellen will be sending out a message as the time get closer on meeting details and making reservations.

Decision: Standardization of Food Storage Orders: State definition of the problem, scale of the issue and put into matrix for executive committee to review by summer meeting.

Who: Dave Schmid

Decision: When the Conservation Strategy is completed for the NCDE, set up a conference call with the Executive Committee to approve/not approve the strategy.

Who: Ken McDonald will provide the NCDE CS to Ellen to send out for review for a couple weeks prior to discussion. Once Ellen has received the CS strategy and sent it out, she will schedule a conference call to discuss.

Action: Between now and the June summer meeting get the IGBC I&E subcommittee up and functioning again in accordance with the IGBC Charter. Set up a conference call with Matt, Martha and Ellen to decide how to proceed.

Who: Ellen Davis

Update: We have selected Kim Annis, MTFWP as the new IGBC I&E Chair and Lori Roberts, MTFWP as the Vice-Chair. We have our first meeting via conference call scheduled in March to discuss finalizing the Information & Education (I&E) section of the IGBC Five-Year Plan goals and objectives as well as work on long-term strategic planning. The Executive I&E committee is made up of the Chair, Vice-Chair, I&E Chairs from each of the ecosystems and Ellen Davis, IGBC Executive Coordinator.

IGBST Research & Monitoring Summary 2017 – Frank gave a PowerPoint presentation to the group. He noted there are 16 members on the study team.

Overview:

- Population estimates and trend,
- Occupancy by females with offspring and;
- Mortalities and mortality rates.

He reminded the group that these are preliminary results.

Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem Monitoring

Population monitoring and trend. Number of females w/cubs using Chao2 estimator.

Observation flights

- 54 aerial observations
- 184 survey hours
- Round 1, 54 units, Round 2, 40 units
- 369 groups
- 510 grizzly bears

50 females w/cubs

- 180 observations
- 50 observation flights
- 65 other aerial
- 58 unique female w/cubs
- 57 in DMA (Demographic Monitoring Area)

1983-2017 increase in trend

2017-46 mortalities in DMA

• 39 human caused

- 7 natural
- 4 undetermined

Food Monitoring

- Cutthroat Trout
- Cutworm Moths

<u>Summary</u>

- High count for females w/cubs n=58
- Population estimate 718
- No evidence of bears leaving core ecosystem.
- Constant since 2005.
