IGBC Mortality Review Tasks

- 1) Produce a preliminary list of priority issues for discussion (June 2019)
- 2) Develop a list of recommendations that address issues (Dec 2019)

NCDE

- Interagency technical group participated in review
- Evaluated mortality data 2 periods: 1999-2008, 2009-2018

Priority Topics:

- 1. Shooting-Related Mortalities
- 2. Railroad Collisions
- 3. Vehicle Collisions
- 4. Site-Related Conflict



NCDE Recommendations

- 1. Shooting-Related Mortalities
 - Targeted I&E at black bear hunters, bird hunters, rifle hunters, recreationists
- 2. Railroad Collisions
 - Review mitigation strategies, livestock exclusion fencing, involve railroads
- 3. Vehicle Collisions
 - Increase engagement with MDT, highway signs, coordination with NGOs
- 4. Site-Related Conflict
 - Waste management, I&E related to small livestock, enforcement

NCDE Recommendations

Overarching Recommendations:

- Establish long-term working groups around each priority
- Consider representatives from external groups
- Coordinate strategies among ecosystems where trends overlap.

GYE Recommendations

- 1. Backcountry Recreation & Hunting-Related Mortalities (YES)
 - Targeted training, food & game storage, funding for outreach, standardize signs
- 2. Front Country Conflicts and Community Planning (YES)
 - Consistent conflict messaging (fed lands), roadside bear mgmt. strategies, NGO partnership funding, programs targeted at municipalities & counties
- 3. Livestock Conflicts and Producer Outreach (YES)
 - Proactive, engage producers, be practical, partnerships with producers as filter
- 4. Efficacy of Information and Education Efforts (IGBC)
 - Use social science experts to determine effective outreach, update material, standardize messaging, proactive funding
- 5. Targeted Community Outreach in Grizzly Bear Expansion Areas (IGBC)
 - Signing in expansion areas, USFS permittees in expansion areas, strategic/proactive, consistency among agencies, centralized leadership for efficiency

Selkirk & Cabinet-Yaak Recommendations

- Bear spray training
- Electric fencing seminars, cost share
- Bear resistant garbage can loaners
- Educational programs
- Increased enforcement (poaching, mistaken ID)
- Mandatory bear ID for black bear hunters (annual)
- Highway fencing, crossing structures, carcass pickup
