I&E Goals and Objectives – IGBC 5-Year Plan

1. Ensure effective communication across all levels of the IGBC

- a) Update Contact lists of I&E contacts at all levels in IGBC member agencies at least once each year.
- b) Review I&E accomplishments and needs with each ecosystem subcommittee at biannual meetings.
- c) Coordinate annual I&E grant program to align use of funds with over all I&E priorities.
- d) Contribute information to update the IGBC website at least once each quarter.

I&E Goals and Objectives – IGBC 5-Year Plan

2. Ensure consistency of messages across all IGBC I&E agencies

- a) Develop curriculum for training staff, interns, and volunteers across IGBC agencies about importance of consistent messages by 2020.
- b) Identify inconsistencies in I&E messages by 2020.
- c) Resolve inconsistencies by 2022.

- 3. Increase use of bear spray by people who live, work, and recreate in bear country
 - a) Produce "testimonial" videos of both short (e.g. 1 minute) and longer duration on effectiveness of bear spray by 2021.



Changing the role of I&E within the IGBC

Going beyond reporting ecosystem activities to public and media

Our meeting later today:

- Standardization of messaging across all ecosystems
- Website; I&E group maintains? Reducing costs?
- IGBC printed materials; content and distribution
- I&E grant process; implementing final reports, include subcommittee I&E chairs in process
- Updating member lists for all ecosystems
- I&E chairs as subcommittee advisors (charter amendment)
- Creating multi-agency I&E working groups in each ecosystem

Using Selkirk/Cabinet-Yaak Subcommittee I&E working group as an example:

- I&E subcommittee chairs: non-voting member/advisor during subcommittee meetings.
- 1 representative per member agency on I&E working group; include others (NGOs) as appropriate.
- Each working group member gathers I&E projects/funding/personnel needs.
- Working group reports these needs to subcommittee
- Subcommittee votes on Ecosystem-wide I&E priorities; move forward collectively
