


### Comprehensive survey about grizzly bears and their management

- ► Mailed household survey included 41 questions
- ➤ Sent to 5350 addresses November 2019 January 2020
- ▶ 1783 completed and returned (688 undeliverable)
- ➤ 38% reporting rate (± 3.5% confidence interval)
- ➤ Survey weighting was used to ensure representative results
- ► This presentation reports statewide results
- ► Additional analyses ongoing





#### Characteristics of Surveyed Montanans


- ► Age: 19-97 years old, average = 50
- Gender:
  - 49% male
  - 50% female
  - 1% other or not disclosed
- ► Industry:
  - 21% agriculture
  - 12% other outdoor industry
  - 6% other industry affected by grizzly bears
- Participation in outdoor activities:
  - 93% outdoor recreation
  - 53% hunting

### Reported experience and proximity to grizzly bears

- ► 68% of Montanans reported they have watched a grizzly bear from afar
- ► 48% reported they have seen a grizzly from outside a vehicle
- ► Grizzly bears live...



#### Most Montanans reported some knowledge about grizzly bears




### Montanans showed positive attitudes about grizzly bears

- ► Grizzly bears have a right to exist in Montana (92% agreed/strongly agreed)
- ► Grizzly bears are beautiful animals (89% agreed/strongly agreed)
- ► Grizzly bears are part of what makes Montana special (85% agreed/strongly agreed)
- ► It is important to maintain a self-sustaining grizzly bear population in MT (75% agreed/strongly agreed)

How would you feel if you were on a hike and saw a grizzly bear...



### Views on size of populations


► The number (or population) of grizzly bears is...too low...too high...right size now




- ► In 7 mapped areas

► The number (or population) of grizzly bears is...






Note: 37-65% of responses = *I don't know* 

#### Acceptance of bears declines with increasing human presence


How acceptable or unacceptable is it to you to have grizzly bears living in the following areas in Montana?




Note: 5-9% of responses = *I don't know* 

### Many Montanans perceive expansion of grizzly bear populations

- ► A majority (58%) of Montanans agreed/agreed strongly with the statement that '*I think grizzly bears are expanding naturally'* 
  - Only 12% disagreed/disagreed strongly with that statement
- ► Grizzly bears live...




#### Moderate to high willingness to take actions

- ► A majority (60%) of Montanans agreed/agreed strongly that *people should learn to live* with grizzly bears near their home
  - Still, 20% disagreed/disagreed strongly with the statement
- ► Indicate *previous actions or* willingness to take actions to reduce potential for grizzly bear-human conflict...



### High support for potential grizzly bear hunting

- ► A majority (61%) of Montanans agreed/agreed strongly that *people should have the* opportunity to hunt grizzly bears as long as their population can withstand the pressure
  - 24% disagreed/disagreed strongly with the statement

### Advantages

✓ High support for grizzly bears: beautiful, special, sustainable

✓ Highly acceptable on public landscapes

✓ People tend to be pleased to see them, even if they are nervous and scared

✓ Almost all Montanans have or are willing to follow food storage orders and carry bear spray

### Challenges

- ✓ Many felt threatened by bears
- ✓ Lower levels of acceptance in areas of human occupancy and agricultural use
  - ✓ Many people believe that bear populations are the 'right size now' irrespective of area
  - ✓ Fewer people were willing to take actions on their own property than on 'wilder' landscapes
