


# **Finished Scare Device Study**

Deployed devices on 21 farms with unsecured attractants

Deterred bears completely at 11 farms 46% reduction in odds attractant accessed Each additional device - additional 44% reduction More effective in August, on treated grain Less effective on groups of bears


### Removed >12,000 pounds of spilled grain

# Finished Guard Dog Study

58-fold fewer bear camera photos at farms w/ dogs 87% less bear collar points near farms after dogs Farmers had positive experiences w/ dogs Farmers w/ dogs would recommend to others



In Revision (Biological Conservation)

### Aggressively hazed bears on 55 occasions 39 cracker shells, 12 rubber slugs, drone






# Finished hazing methods study

- Hazing stopped undesirable behavior
- Aversive conditioning occurred over longer periods
- Drones most successful, then projectiles, vehicles, dogs Pursuit possibility increased 122 times for drones relative to using a vehicle
- Flight locations were further from roads, closer to waterways

# Finished hazing methods study

Dogs had an 85% reduction in odds of successful hazing





# **Capture Summary**

In conjunction with USDA, an adult female bear collared for proactive monitoring in a conflict hotspot area (5/2).

 In conjunction with USDA, an adult female bear was recaptured for the fourth time and refitted with a collar for proactive monitoring in a conflict hotspot area (6/1).

# **Grizzly Bear Mortality Summary**

- 1) In conjunction with USDA, a yearling female was euthanized for livestock and other complaints in the area, while relocation was unavailable due to snow (3/13).
- 2) Yearling female bear was found dead under investigation (6/7).
- 3) Subadult female was found dead under investigation (8/4).
- 4) Yearling male was euthanized due to habituation that was not being resolved with relocation and numerous hazing events (8/24).
- 5) Collared adult female was found dead under investigation (10/6).
