- Experienced in predator/livestock conflict




Figure 1. MFWP Region 4 and the portion of the region Choteau Bear Management Team is generally responsible for.














Captures

- 716 (Management) 3/15
 - A young male was observed chasing cattle in Simms. FWP captured and collared the bear. USFWS relocated. The bear was removed 3/25 for a confirmed cattle depredation.
- 718 (Research) 8/15
 - An adult female without cubs was captured and collared west of Augusta for research and monitoring for MT FWP Trend Monitoring team.
- 720 (Management) 9/16
 - An adult male was captured near Bynum after eating under a back yard apple tree while a LGD hazed the bear. This bear was collared and relocated.
- 721(Research) 10/30
 - An adult female without cubs was captured and collared west of Augusta for research and monitoring for MT FWP Trend Monitoring team.



Mortalities

- March 25 (Management)- a collared management male was euthanized for livestock depredation conflict.
- ♦ April 25 (DOL)- An unmarked female was shot and killed in a defense of life encounter near Wolf Creek. A single cubof-the-year was captured and placed with Wildlife Images in Oregon.
- Aug 28 (Vehicle)- An unmarked yearling female was struck by a vehicle and killed SW of Augusta.
- Sept 20 (Mistaken ID)- An adult male, previously collared by FWP was killed by a black bear hunter in a mistaken ID. The bear was still wearing its collar, but the collar was not functional when it was killed.


Bears Frequenting Area



♦ 5/30, Choteau Call Multiplier Alert, a lone young bear as well as a female with 3 cubs of the year spending extended time on the edge of City limits. Female grizzly demonstrated defensive behavior. While no food conflicts were reported, unsuccessful preventative capture and relocation efforts were made for both events to elevate human safety and decrease risk of conflict.Signs were placed in the areas of activity and homeowners in the immediate vicinities were notified and invited to Teton BearSmart meeting to share thoughts and concerns.

- ♦ 6/10, Choteau Call Multiplier Alert, Lone young bear again seen inside city limits.
- ♦ **6/23, Neighborhood Call Tree** south of Choteau initiated to notify landowners of bear activity in the area.
- ♦ 10/23, Neighborhood Call Tree south of Choteau initiated to notify landowners of bear activity in the area.
- ♦ 11/8, Neighborhood Call Tree in the Dutton area was used to notify landowners of bear activity in the area.
